These were clues that appeared daily alongside a mystery bag while Gan Daled was learning that fall is

a time of harvest. After four days, they children wrote their predictions of what the mystery bag contained. Many children accurately predicted a pumpkin. The pumpkin afforded us many hands on math activities as Gan Daled measured the circumference of the pumpkin and estimated the number of seeds inside it. When the children realized that they could not measure the circumference with a standard ruler, they turned to a tape measure and string. This unit concluded with a sensory experience as the class tasted the roasted seeds and pumpkin.



Continuing with our study of fall, Gan Daled adopted a tree and named it Woody. We have been observing Woody as the school year progresses. In the early fall, Woody had beautiful, colorful leaves. After doing some research, we learned that Woody is a maple tree. Now Woody's branches are quite bare. The class tried to console Woody on his loss of foliage by drawing beautiful pictures and hanging them on the tree. Woody looked happier and so did the children!



ELLIS ISLAND

As a culmination of the study of immigration, Yavneh's fifth graders visited Ellis Island. Ayal Yakobe expresses his feelings as well as that of his classmates:

My Trip to Ellis Island by Ayal Yakobe

Going to Ellis Island was an exciting experience, one that I will never forget. When the bus left the turnpike and we saw the Statue of Liberty, my classmates burst into a resounding "Star Spangled Banner." I got the same feeling that my family had after a tiring journey to an exciting new world of opportunities. The ferry was fun because we could explore the ship and talk about what it must have been like on a similar ferry to Ellis Island 100 years ago. The best part of the ferry ride was seeing Lady Liberty. Her strong hands holding the torch symbolize the hope of freedom in America.

Our tour guide, Doug, explained to us about the treatment of the immigrants and the time it took to pass the many tests the immigrants took before being admitted. The museum had pictures of real people and their stories. I loved asking questions about the many artifacts. I can only imagine how the people from many different countries felt, nervous, hopeful, sad, and happy, whatever feelings united people in Ellis Island.

After the tour, we played a Jeopardy-type game. Each of us had a buzzer and we had to buzz in the right answer. Our class did exceptionally well on questions about waves of immigrants and their experiences.

I loved the trip to Ellis Island, and I thank Yavneh for this.





SIX FLAGS READING PROGRAM LAUNCHED

Earn a ticket to Great Adventure as you read!

Yavneh students from Kindergarten through sixth grade have the opportunity to earn tickets to Six Flags theme parks by doing six hours of recreational reading. Last year 112 Yavneh students participated; our goal this year is to exceed that number of students. Mrs. Elaine Weisfeld is coordinating the program and will supply any additional information or forms.

The program requires that students submit records of six hours of leisure reading, verified by a parent to their classroom teacher by February 18th. The program maintains a strict deadline. The forms and information describing the program to parents have been distributed to teachers in grades K-6. Students must keep track of the books they read and the time spent reading. Teachers submit forms listing those students who have satisfied the six hour requirement. Participants experience the intrinsic joy of reading while they earn theme park tickets which they can use during the summer.

PARENTING POINTERS

Y.A.P. Happenings

November has been a busy month in our Y.A.P. (Yavneh Advisory Program). Each grade's programming is specifically fine-tuned to fit the "current events" or "inyanei d'yoma" in the lives of our students.

Our sixth graders have been focusing heavily on transition skills. We first helped them realize the different organizational skills they need this year as they enter Middle School. Systems that worked for them in the past, may not work this year. They had the opportunity to assess their own skills in that area, and identify target areas on which to work. They all learned a technique for organizing their bookbags and lockers. Aside from the academic transitions in their lives, they are also entering a new social era- that of Bar and Bat Mitzvahs. We walked them through a Bat/Bar Mitzvah celebration and discussed appropriate comportment at each aspect of the day. We ended the month, appropriately, through speaking about how to truly be grateful all year round for what we have and how that gratitude can make us happier people.

The seventh grade spent much time preparing themselves for the Frost Valley experience so that they could benefit the most from every moment. We highlighted with them some of the skills they would need to succeed on the trip. When they returned, we "debriefed" the experience with them so that they could concretize for themselves what they learned about their peers, their teachers and themselves. We then embarked on a unit on not standing idly by when injustice or wrong is happening around them. What is their responsibility? When should they get an adult involved?

Our eighth grade began the year by thinking about what type of high school student do each of them want to be, i.e. whom do they want to become in the next four years, and how will their choice of high school affect that development? We then walked them through the application process which can be daunting for some- What should the photograph I choose look like? What type of

responses do they want in the essay? Students then had the opportunity to gain tips on the interview and to even practice. As it got close to the BJE exam, we shared with them some of the "unknowns" about how the day will run, and what they can expect. And, they learned some test-taking strategies that are applicable to most tests they will take in their lives. The goal of this unit was to minimize stress through sharing with the students what they can expect.


