## Making Magid Meaningful



### Before the seder

#### Audience Participation

Give each guest three slips of paper: Comment, Question, and Share a Story. Tell them that everyone is required use their slips of paper during the seder. This will help set the tone for participation.

### As the seder begins

#### Whose Job Is It?

Pass around a jar that is filled with various job descriptions. Everyone should pick out a job from the jar and complete their task during the seder. Jobs can include hiding the Afikomen, singing the Ma Nishtana, introducing and/or reading key parts of the Haggadah.

### Arami Oved Avi

#### Props or Paper Bag Dramatics

Pass around an object-it can be anything-and ask how you would use in coming out of Egypt. Alternatively, if you have more time, provide a bag of props and have people put on a brief play using their props. You can give each group a phrase like Let My People Go, Can We Eat Yet or Next Year in Jerusalem that they must use in their skit.

### After the Four Questions

#### Pesach Poses aka Charades

Everyone takes a card and act out what's on it. Everyone else guesses what the person is doing. Some ideas for cards include taking cover from hail, offering the korban pesach, walking through the split sea, opening the door for Eliyahu, and finding the afikomen.

### B'chol Dor V'Dor

#### Moshe's Staff

Take a broom handle- it is the staff of Moses which by a miracle has come to the seder. Have each person introduce the person to their right and share what they remember about him/her when they left Egypt together.

### Hasal Seder Pesach- Completing the seder

#### 6 Word Memoirs

Ask participants: "Can you describe yourself in 6 words?" "Can you share your seder experience in 6 words?" "Can you write your life's story in 6 words?"
